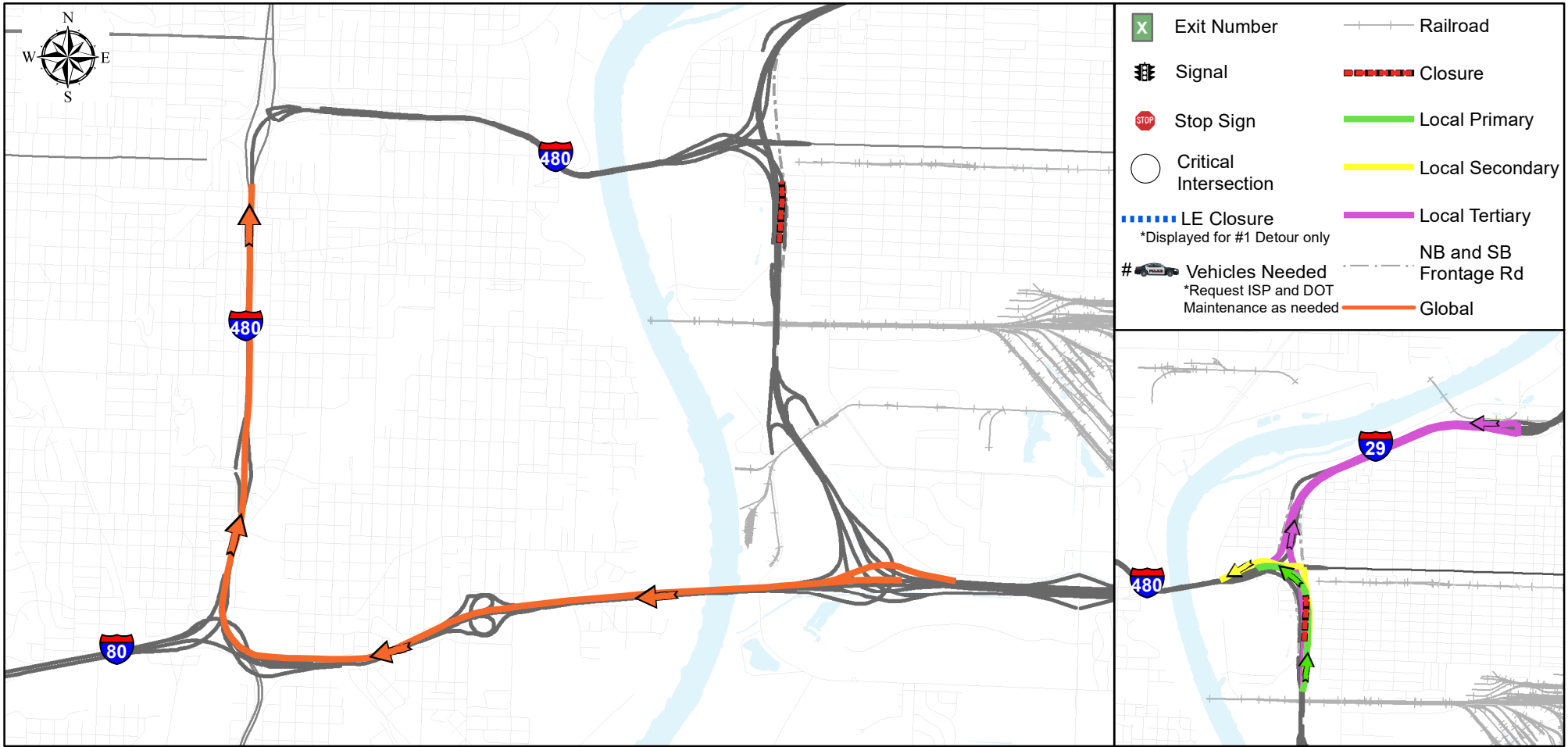

Minor Impacts to Traffic	
Typical Scenario	Incident Management Response
Shoulder Blocked	Deploy DMS informational message for approaching traffic from same direction
Off Peak - Shoulder and 1 Lane Blocked	Diversion Not Implemented: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - On scene traffic control - DMS informational messages deployed for approaching traffic

Major Impact to Traffic Expected Duration < 2 Hours	
Typical Scenario	Incident Management Response
Peak Period - Shoulder Blocked	Deploy DMS informational message for approaching traffic from same direction.
Off Peak - Shoulder and 1 Lane Blocked	Partial Diversion: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - On scene traffic control - Deploy DMS messaging directing through traffic to use global detour - Deploy DMS messaging directing approaching traffic to use local alternate routes
All Lanes Blocked	Diversion Implemented: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - On scene traffic control - Deploy DMS messaging directing through traffic to use global detour - Deploy law enforcement to direct traffic at critical intersections - Deploy DMS messaging directing approaching traffic to use local alternate routes

Major Impact to Traffic Expected Duration > 2 Hours	
Typical Scenario	Incident Management Response
Off Peak - Shoulder and 1 Lane Blocked	Partial Diversion: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Deploy cones/barricades and other appropriate traffic control devices - Deploy DMS messaging directing through traffic to use global detour - Deploy DMS messaging directing approaching traffic to use local alternate routes
All Lanes Blocked	Diversion Implemented: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Deploy cones/barricades and other appropriate traffic control devices - Deploy DMS messaging directing through traffic to use global detour - Deploy law enforcement to direct traffic at critical intersections - Deploy DMS messaging directing approaching traffic to use local alternate routes

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RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Pottawattamie County Emergency Communications
- Dispatch Council Bluffs Police and Pottawattamie County Sheriff
- Dispatch Council Bluffs Fire/EMS - include scene access information
- Notify Iowa DOT TMC
- Set up patch for direct communication between emergency responders
- Dispatch towing as soon as possible - include scene access information

2. Iowa DPS Emergency Communications
- Dispatch State Patrol
- Notify Iowa DOT TMC
- Set up patch for direct communication between emergency responders

3. Douglas County Emergency Communications
- Notify emergency responders of global route in place

4. Iowa DOT TMC
- Deploy appropriate DMS and 511 messages
- Contact NDOT SOC (402-331-5993) to deploy Global DMS messages
- Implement Local and Global Detours
- Provide alternate route information to Pottawattamie and Douglas County Emergency Communications to notify emergency responders
- Monitor Critical Intersections along detour route and request LE traffic control, if needed
- If traffic is detoured onto City of Council Bluffs streets, contact CB Public Works (712-328-4645) to adjust signal timings
- Coordinate with Iowa DOT Maintenance and Highway Helper for traffic control needs; including moving arrows on permanent signing along city streets to reflect active detour
- Contact DOT construction to stop hauling activities, if necessary

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5. NDOT SOC
- Deploy appropriate DMS and 511 messages
- Notify Nebraska State Patrol
- Provide alternate route information to Douglas County Emergency Communications to notify emergency responders
- Monitor global diversion routes in Nebraska

6. City of Council Bluffs Public Works
- Activate appropriate emergency detour signal timing plan for detour route
- If detour route does not have emergency detour signal timing plan, adjust signal timings along route appropriately
- Monitor traffic along detour route
- Notify Pottawattamie County Emergency Communications if Law Enforcement is needed along detour route
